MVL and Highway 14 Expansion

On or about March 15, 2022, construction will begin on the expansion of Highway 14 between Nicollet and New Ulm. Regardless of what you have heard about the construction, there is one point on which all of us can agree: there will be an impact on MVL. MNDOT will be purchasing approximately eight acres of MVL's property for right of way purposes. It is likely we will have to move our softball fields or make some changes. If you've driven by MVL, you've already noticed that our large concrete sign out front has been moved.


MVL Girl's Varsity Basketball

Certified Nursing Assistant Class

In an effort to continue expanding our offerings and help with providing productive and preparatory classes for all occupation fields, MVL added a Certified Nursing Assistant Class this past fall. The course was offered through Oak Hills Living Center in New Ulm. The students paid a course fee up front, but were then reimbursed if they worked for Oak Hills for a set number of months after completion of the course.

Most of the feedback from the three student who took the course was positive. They appreciated the fact they were able to work on the book and online portions of the class during the school day. The clinical and skilled lab days needed to be completed on site during scheduled, 8 hour, weekend days. With outside jobs and activities, those were a bit more challenging to schedule. The students felt the course was worthwhile and quite beneficial. One student noted that it was good practical experience for her chosen career.

After completing the course and passing the state test, they are now able to work as CNAs in area nursing homes or hospitals. With the growing needs for professionals in medical field, we are hoping this will be of interest and helpful to students going forward!
