MVL Building on the Rock Construction Update

While getting to MVL may be one of the most difficult drives you or your child does over the course of the week, witnessing the changes to our campus these next few weeks is well worth that drive! The roof, floor, and pre-cast walls, are installed on the new science/technology wing of our addition! As I write this, the walls of the new welcome area are going up. By the second week of November, the entire shell of the building will be in place. Many other things are happening as well...

- New sidewalk in front of the current entrance will be poured over MEA break.
- The transformer will be moved by the bus shed during MEA break.
- Design meetings are happening and various renditions are being created for the "MVL Plaza" –the outdoor space that will connect the "old" to the "new".
- The gym floor designs and scoreboard/video board needs for the new gym are being finalized.
- Meetings are happening regarding software (i.e. – digital trophy case and video wall) needs for the new welcoming area.
- We are currently researching vendors to assist us with purchasing stage curtains and rigging for the new event center.
- Theater seats for the new event center have been ordered.

We certainly appreciate all the people – both contracted workers and volunteers alike who are working to make our project a success. While the drive to MVL might pose a challenge at the moment, we encourage you to tackle it a time or two during the next few weeks to watch the MVL campus being transformed right before your eyes. BOTR Science Classrooms


For several months, it seemed like all we saw was dirt, machinery, and rubble. That is what was needed to prepare a firm foundation for the new addition. Then one day not so long ago, semi trucks drove in and dropped off the lattice crawler crane that has been sitting onsite since. Its enormous presence on campus is impressive! What is even more exciting, however, is watching the walls go up and the structure take form. It's been amazing to see the progress! Large slab walls were lifted by the crane and gently set in place with what looked like little effort. Within two weeks, the walls of the new science classrooms were complete. Jennifer Uher, who teaches Physical Science and Biology, is excited for the completion of this new learning center.

"I'm so excited to see how these new state-of-the-art classrooms can take the learning and experiences in the science classroom to a whole new level! The rooms will offer a great deal more space to fit our growing class size, allowing students to move around easily and safely within the classroom. The new space will have both a lecture space with tables, as a well as a space specifically for lab work."

Each new lab station will provide water, gas, electricity, and storage. They will replace the outdated, leaky, and crowded tables. The space will provide plenty of room to work with a partner or collaborate with other groups. The lab area will also provide the teacher with plenty of space to walk around the stations and easily monitor and help students at work. Extra screens placed in the lab area will allow biology students to easily see teacher-led dissections and other demonstration up-close from any spot in the lab.
